

The Good Health Clinic 2017 Year in Review



Better Serving Our Community

Good Health Clinic leadership strives to constantly assess and meet the ever changing medical needs of our community from Key Largo to Key West. This year we are proud to have implemented several new program areas for our patients.

Pediatrics

The clinic is now accepting and handling the medical needs of children who have fallen through the cracks. A local pediatrician partnered with our medical team to care for all those 17 years and younger. Patients are seen both in our clinic and in the private provider offices ensuring general wellness, vaccines, and illness are cared for. Parents are also able to speak with GHC Patient Care Coordinators to receive information regarding child Medicaid availability.

Dental

Good Health Clinic has partnered with local dentists to provide limited, emergency dental care for our patients. We are also working on partnerships with mobile units to provide robust dental services to those in need. The first mobile dental visit is expected in January 2018 and will serve over 100 patients.

Primary Care Mental Health Model

Anxiety and Depression are the two most common mental health issues facing our community, particularly in the wake of Hurricane Irma. Good Health Clinic has developed and is implementing a new integrated health model proven successful by other free clinics. With the help of local councilors, pharmaceutical donors, and national associations we will ensure positive health outcomes for our patients and remove the mental health barriers to achieving social and physical health goals.

Hurricane Irma and Good Health Clinic

Hurricane Irma has, and will continue, to impact the Florida Keys in economic, cultural, and personal ways for a very long time. While recovery is fast under way, our community continues to see and respond to needs from the long term effects.

Immediately following the Hurricane, Good Health Clinic was able to work with our national partners, AmeriCares and Direct Relief, who collectively provided over \$200k in relief medical supplies and pharmaceuticals. Here at the clinic we have will seen an almost 20% increase in patients by the end of 2017, and expect that number to continue to grow.

In order to assist our hurricane impacted community members the clinic established temporary policies including:

- Immediately following the hurricane Good Health Clinic opened its doors to any community member seeking urgent care for hurricane related injuries
- Any insured or uninsured community member who is unable to afford needed non-controlled medications may contact clinic to receive medications free from our stock
- Any patient may utilize donor provided refrigeration at clinic to store medications until they are again in stable housing

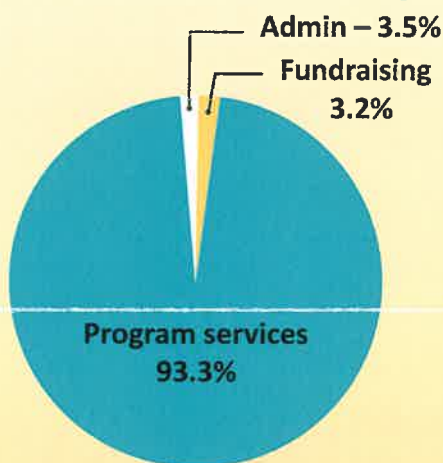

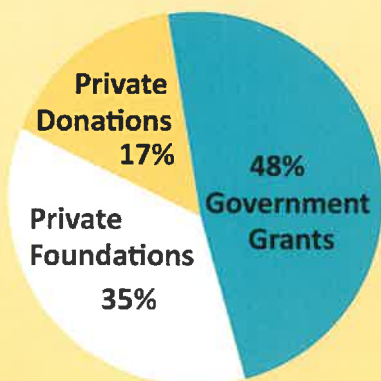
